### BIBLE / TORAH KNOWLEDGE

The Jewish Bible has three sections, and a total of 24 books. The first section is called the **TORAH**. There are 5 books in the Torah, they are (English/Hebrew):

1. Genesis *Beresheet*
2. Exodus *Sh'mot*
3. Leviticus *Vayikra*
4. Numbers *Bamidbar*
5. Deuteronomy *Devarim*



The second section of the Jewish Bible is called **NEVI'IM**, or the Prophets. They are:

6. Joshua
7. Judges
8. Samuel, I & II
9. Kings, I & II
10. Isaiah
11. Jeremiah
12. Ezekiel
13. The Twelve Prophets (counted as one book) are: Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi

The third section of the Jewish Bible is called **KETUVIM**, or the "Writings". They are:

**Sh'ma** *Yisrael Adonai Elohaynu Adonai Echad*  
Hear Israel, the Lord our G-d, the Lord is One

**(Blessing for Shabbat Candlelighting):**  
*Baruch atah Adonai, Elohaynu melekh ha-olam, asher kid'shanu be'mitzvo tav, ve'tzivanu, le-hadlik ner shel Shabbat..*

Blessed are you Lord, Our G-d, King of the Universe, who has sanctified us with His commandments, and commanded us to kindle the light of the holy Shabbat.

**(Blessing for Wine):** *Baruch atah Adonai, Elohaynu melekh ha-olam, borei p'riy ha-gafen.*

Blessed are you Lord, Our G-d, King of the Universe, who creates the fruit of the vine.

**(Blessing for Washing Hands):** *Baruch atah Adonai, Elohaynu melekh ha-olam, asher kid'shanu be'mitzvo tav, ve'tzivanu, al ne'tilat y'dayim.*

Blessed are you Lord, Our G-d, King of the Universe, who has sanctified us with His commandments, and commanded us concerning washing of hands.

**(Blessing for Bread):** *Baruch atah Adonai, Elohaynu melekh ha-olam, ha'motzi lechem min ha'aretz.*

Blessed are you Lord, Our G-d, King of the Universe, who brings forth bread from the earth.

The Seven Days of Creation:

1. Light
2. Sky
3. Land and Water
4. Sun and Stars
5. Fish and Birds
6. Animals, Man
7. Shabbat and Rest!

The Jewish bible is called the "TaNaKh" because "T", "N", and "K" are the first letters in Torah, Nevi'im, and Ketuvim.

The Ten Commandments are:

3. Don't say G-d's name for no reason,
4. Remember the Sabbath,
5. Honor your Parents,
6. Don't Murder,
7. Don't commit adultery,
8. Don't Steal,

**MAJOR CITIES IN ISRAEL**

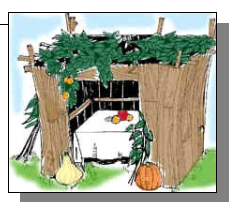


The city of Jerusalem is divided into four quarters: The Jewish Quarter, the Christian Quarter, the Muslim Quarter and the Armenian

*Modeh ani lefaneicha, melech chai v'kayam, shehechezarta bi nishmati bechemlah - rabbah emunatecha!*

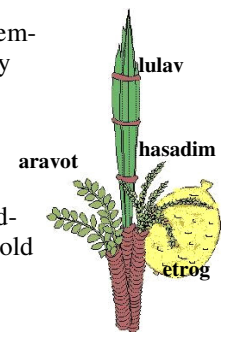
I gratefully thank you, O living and eternal King, for You have returned my soul within me with compassion - abundant is Your faithfulness!

The holiday of **Sukkot** is symbolized by **four species**:



The “**Etrog**,” the Citron, resembles in its shape, the heart, the driving force behind all our actions.

The “**Lulav**,” the Palm Branch, resembles the spine, which holds the body together and, without which, we would be unable to move.



The “**Hadasim**,” or Myrtle Branches, resemble, in their almond-shape, the eyes, with which we behold G-d's World.

And the “**Aravot**,” the Willow Branches, resemble the lips, with which we give expression to our thoughts and feelings.

**5 COUNTRIES SURROUNDING ISRAEL**



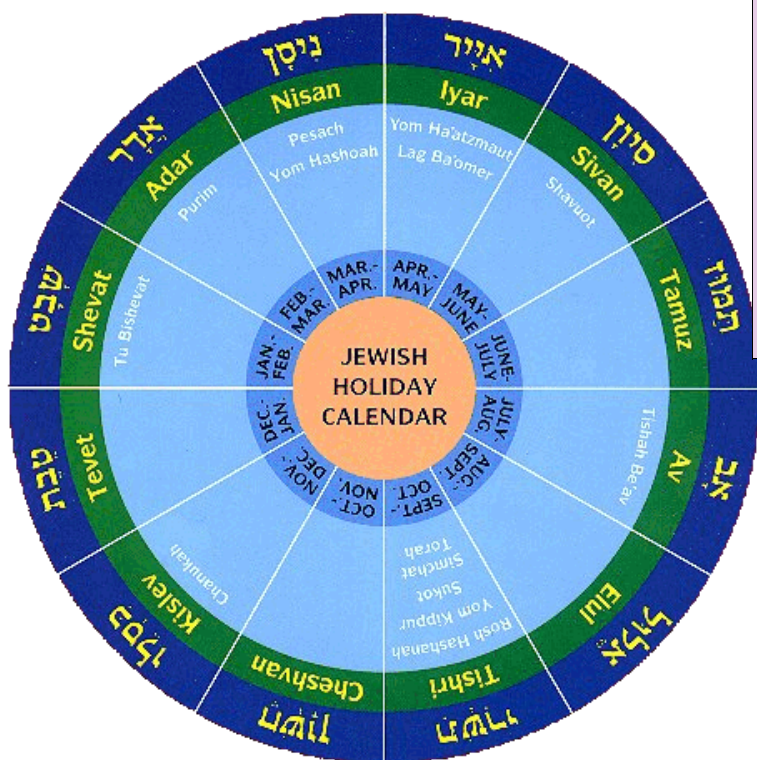
The seven species of the holiday “**Tu B'Shvat**” are:  
 wheat, barley, grapes, olives, dates, figs, and pomegranates.

The 8 levels of **zedakah**, from the least meritorious to the most meritorious, are:

1. Giving begrudgingly
2. Giving less that you should, but giving it cheerfully.
3. Giving after being asked
4. Giving before being asked
5. Giving when you do not know the recipient's identity, but the recipient knows your identity
6. Giving when you know the recipient's identity, but the recipient doesn't know your identity
7. Giving when neither party knows the other's identity
8. Enabling the recipient to become self-reliant

Here are some of the **kosher** guidelines (need to know 5 for points):

*Animals must be slaughtered without undue pain, Dairy and Meat are not served at the same meal, Separate dishes for dairy and meat, plates and utensils should be "kashered" (made kosher if previously used for non-kosher food), prepared foods need kosher symbol, parve food (neither dairy nor meat) may be eaten with anything, kosher fish must have fins and scales, kosher land animals must have cloven hooves and chew their cud, no insect or crustacean is kosher (except for one type of grasshopper, ick!)*
